FINANCIAL STATEMENT:

- 2. Approve Bill Payments H Comm. Maddalena moved to approve the financial statements and payment of bills, Comm. Hunter seconded. Roll Call Vote: 7 Ayes (Burt, McCollum, Rowson, Maddalena, Hunter, Archer, Fisher) motion passed.

REPORTS & REQUESTS FROM DISTRICT CHIEF, BATTALION CHIEFS AND EMS COORDINATOR:

- 1. Chief's Report (Response Summary, Fleet, Communications System, Facilities) Chief Connolly reported just completing a 9 day county-wide prepositioning, the district also received calls to a critical motorcycle crash and incidental fires from a logging operation off 54 road on Yuba Pass. W82 was out of service for a couple weeks and E282 briefly. They did extensive clean up at Station 84, Pat Blide fabricated a plate for the siren bracket, Mike Cory installed the new lights at the Sierraville station, Serenity helped price and order rope rescue equipment.
- 2. Training / Recruitment/ Retention Recent training included a rope rescue course and Zach from the USFS put on a FFT1 training. The USFS crew invited the SCFPD crew down for dinner one night and the next Ben Hitchcock BBQ'd at the Sierraville station in return. He used a hydrant in Calpine for a fire drill and felt that the water flows were low. Rudy Hoyos showed the public how to use a fire extinguisher during the Family Fun Fest/Calpine Marketplace event. There is a hydrant in Sierraville that may have been hit and needs repair. There was additional discussion regarding the hydrant marking systems. All hydrants are exercised at least once per year.
- 3. Approval of Assignment of Deputy Chief- B. Hitchcock Volunteer Ben Hitchcock, who joined the meeting via telephone was introduced. Chief Connolly discussed his qualifications and contributions to the District and nominated him for Deputy Chief. Comm. Rowson moved to approve the nomination, Comm. McCollum seconded. Comm. Archer questioned Mr. Hitchcock's further on his background. Roll Call Vote: 7 Ayes (Burt, McCollum, Rowson, Maddalena, Hunter, Archer, Fisher) motion passed.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- 1. Update on Calpine siren project (Shawn/Jeff) The District is working to get a boom truck to move the siren.
- 2. Update on Sattley property project (Rick) Comm. Maddalena reported that there was power to the pump and it is ready to use, he thanked Alley Electric for donating some time on the project. We are waiting for a quote on a prefab 6 x 6 pumphouse and there is a notable water leak needing repair.
- 3. Follow up on TNF Agreement (Rick) In process.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Review of Annual Audit H The Commission reviewed the annual audit presented and the Clerk noted requested edits. Comm. Archer clarify the District's capital assets valued at acquisition costs vs actual value. It was discussed that there were no findings or material weaknesses reported.
- 2. Approve opening bank accounts with Plumas Bank and closing Wells Fargo, authorize signers Comm. Archer moved to open a checking and savings account with Plumas Bank, Inc. and add Clerk Kelly Champion as a signer for administrative purposes and to acquire an ATM/Debit card, and add all Commissioners as signers including Shawn Burt, Jeff McCollum, Thomas Rowson, Richard Maddalena, Candance Hunter, Thomas Archer, and Victoria Fisher; and to transfer funds from Wells Fargo and close the checking and savings accounts with Wells Fargo Bank. Comm. Fisher seconded. Roll Call Vote: 7 Ayes (Burt, McCollum, Rowson, Maddalena, Hunter, Archer, Fisher) motioned passed.
- 3. Preposition Pay for Volunteers (Tom R./Mick) H Comm. Archer moved to authorize prepositioning payment for the volunteers up to 50%, estimated at \$18,920.20 conditioned on the acceptance of CalOES for payment to the District, Comm. McCollum seconded. Roll Call Vote: 7 Ayes (Burt, McCollum, Rowson, Maddalena, Hunter, Archer, Fisher) motion passed.
- 4. Calpine Pond Dredging (Rick) Comm. Maddalena reported that the cost of a required CA Dept of Fish & Game frog survey was high in comparison to the available funding for the project. The group was seeking possible relief, still planning to complete the project in the fall.
- 5. DigitalPath Proposal (Rick) Comm. Maddalena presented a proposal from DigitalPath to use power from the Sierraville station. There was discussion and the consensus of the Commission was to request a more formal proposal with specific details. Comm. McCollum would like the power source to be on a dedicated breaker.
- 6. Pump System for WT-82 (including thank you to contributors) (Rick) Comm. Maddalena reported on the repairs done for the hydraulic pump system on WT82. The Commission thanked Al Pombo, Troy Carson, and Paul Roen for their time and contributions to the District in getting the apparatus back in service.

ANNOUNCEMENTS AND COMMENTS: Comm. Rowson volunteered to be the District representative and point of contact with CA Dept of Fish & Wildlife for the Smithneck Creek Wildlife Area Fire Resiliency Advisory Group.

Request for Fee Increase: Consistent with the Sierra County Resolution 2021-018 and County processes clarified in March of 2022 leading to Resolution No. 2022-031, the District requests the fire mitigation fee be increased by 3% from \$1.96 per building square foot to \$2.02 per square foot to adjust for inflation in accordance with the Fire Development Impact Fee Nexus Study prepared by Hansford Economic Consulting, dated July 15, 2020 and Sierra County Resolution 2021-018. The Engineering News Record, San Francisco Construction Cost Index March 2021 to March 2022 percentage change is 8.9%. Sierra County Resolution No. 2021-018 caps the fee increase at 3%. The District asks that the Public Hearing on the fee increase be held in the Eastern part of the County to maximize the opportunity for public and District participation.

2022/2023 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN SIERRA COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT #1

Pursuant to Section 66006 of Government Code, the District is required to annually make available to the public specific information related to the prior year's activity for development impact fees within 180 days after the last day of each fiscal year.

Sierra County Fire Protection District #1 collects development impact fees within Fire District boundaries which includes the noncorporated communities of Sierraville, Sattley, Calpine, Sierra Brooks, Loyalton Pines, Long Valley and Verdi and neighboring ranches, farms, and recreation attractions. Development Impact Fees were first approved by the Sierra County Fire District Board of Commissioners and the Sierra County Board of Supervisors in 2011.

The content of this report will outline the spending plan for those fees collected up to and including fiscal year ending 6/30/2022 as well as 5 year projections.

An annual inventory of fee collection and projects funded since the imposition of the District's Impact Fee is available upon request.

FIRE IMPACT FEE SCHEDULE

An updated Fire Impact Fee Nexus Study was completed by Hansford Economic Consulting and approved by the Sierra County Fire Protection District Board of Commissioners and the Sierra County Board of Supervisors in 2020.
