# RESOLUTION DEFINING TERM OF OFFICE FOR SIERRA COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT NO. 1 DIRECTORS

**WHEREAS**, the Sierra County Fire Protection District No. 1 (District) was originally formed in 1930 with management performed by Commissioners who acted as agents of the Sierra County Board of Supervisors; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Fire Protection District Law of 1961, the Sierra County Fire Protection District No. 1 reorganized in 1964 operating as an independent five member governing Board of Directors appointed by the Sierra County Board of Supervisors not for any fixed term; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Protection District Law of 1987 established a four year term of office for a Board of Directors pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 13843 (a), and authorized Commissioners acting by delegation of authority, to be appointed at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors or for staggered terms of four years subject to removal for cause pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 13844.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that following review of the law and history of the Sierra County Fire Protection District No. 1, the Sierra County Board of Supervisors hereby concludes that the District is no longer governed by Commissioners acting as agents on behalf of the Board of Supervisors, instead the District is governed by a Board of Directors requiring said Directors to serve a four year term of office or until his or her successor qualifies and takes office pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 13843(a).

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Sierra County Board of Supervisors in accordance with the Fire Protection District Law of 1987 and Health and Safety Code section 13843(a), hereby organizes the term of office for the existing Board of Directors of the Sierra County Fire Protection District No. 1 as follows:

### RESOLUTION AMENDING THE SIERRA COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT #1 FIRE DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEE

WHEREAS, Sierra County Code Section 12.06.050 establishes development fees within the boundaries of the Sierra County Fire Protection District #1; and

WHEREAS, said fees may be amended by resolution adopted by the Board of Supervisors upon presentation by the District of an appropriate impact analysis; and

**WHEREAS**, the Sierra County Fire Protection District adopted Resolution No. 2020-004 and Resolution 2020-007 approving the Capital Asset and Replacement Study and the Nexus Study prepared by Hansford Economic Consulting, dated July 15, 2020; and

WHEREAS, said Nexus Study recommends an increase each fiscal year, using the Engineering News Record San Francisco Construction Cost Index March to March percentage change for the prior twelve months, and

WHEREAS, the Sierra County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution 2021-018 approving an increase in the fire development impact fees and authorizing an automatic increase upon annual review by the Board of Supervisors, not to exceed 3%, and in conjunction with the receipt of the annual report regarding expenditure of fees; and

**WHEREAS**, on December 6, 2022, the Board of Supervisors reviewed the Sierra County Fire Protection District No. 1 Fiscal Year 2021/2022 annual report for the District's Fee Mitigation Program and the District's updated Capital Improvement Plan.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Sierra County Board of Supervisors, County of Sierra, State of California does hereby approve an increase in the fire development impact fees authorized by Sierra County Code Section 12.06.040 within the boundaries of the Sierra County Fire Protection District No. 1, from \$1.96 per building square foot to \$2.02 per building square foot.

### Dear Supervisors:

**Revised Capitol Investment Plan:** Following a public hearing held on August 16, 2022, the Sierra County Fire Protection District #1 (the District) adopted the attached revised Capitol Investment Plan by Resolution 2202-07. The adopted plan and resolution are attached as Exhibits A and B.

**Annual Report:** Consistent with Sierra County Resolution 2021-018, the District hereby submits the following report of Fire Mitigation Fees collection and expenditures:

Balance Brought Forward July 1 2022: \$0.00

Amount Held Longer Than 5 Years: \$0.00

Accounts Receivable (Accrued but not received) from Prior Periods: \$4,820

FY 21/22 Collections Received from Auditor: \$22,179.78

FY 21/22 Collections Received from Building Dept: \$22,179.78

Expenditures Made with Mitigation Fees in FY 21/22: \$10,000

Net Receipts Pooled for Future Investments: \$46,426

Request for Fee Increase: Consistent with the Sierra County Resolution 2021-018 and County processes clarified in March of 2022 leading to Resolution No. 2022-031, the District requests the fire mitigation fee be increased by 3% from \$1.96 per building square foot to \$2.02 per square foot to adjust for inflation in accordance with the Fire Development Impact Fee Nexus Study prepared by Hansford Economic Consulting, dated July 15, 2020 and Sierra County Resolution 2021-018. The Engineering News Record, San Francisco Construction Cost Index March 2021 to March 2022 percentage change is 8.9%. Sierra County Resolution No. 2021-018 caps the fee increase at 3%. The District asks that the Public Hearing on the fee increase be held in the Eastern part of the County to maximize the opportunity for public and District participation.

### 2022/2023 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN SIERRA COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT #1

Pursuant to Section 66006 of Government Code, the District is required to annually make available to the public specific information related to the prior year's activity for development impact fees within 180 days after the last day of each fiscal year.

Sierra County Fire Protection District #1 collects development impact fees within Fire District boundaries which includes the noncorporated communities of Sierraville, Sattley, Calpine, Sierra Brooks, Loyalton Pines, Long Valley and Verdi and neighboring ranches, farms, and recreation attractions. Development Impact Fees were first approved by the Sierra County Fire District Board of Commissioners and the Sierra County Board of Supervisors in 2011.

The content of this report will outline the spending plan for those fees collected up to and including fiscal year ending 6/30/2022 as well as 5 year projections.

An annual inventory of fee collection and projects funded since the imposition of the District's Impact Fee is available upon request.

### FIRE IMPACT FEE SCHEDULE

An updated Fire Impact Fee Nexus Study was completed by Hansford Economic Consulting and approved by the Sierra County Fire Protection District Board of Commissioners and the Sierra County Board of Supervisors in 2020. The purpose of the Fire Impact Fees is to finance public facilities and equipment as described.
